- Conducted legislative analysis on the impact of Pell Grants, Veteran's Benefits, and middle-dollar ISA programs to develop evidence-based solutions to executive leadership for buy-in and implementation. Led to the development of the extended income-based repayment plan designed to give alumni more flexibility in paying back student loans.
- Drafted policies to support the execution of legislative changes, communicating them through memos, handbooks, and trainings. Led to the creation of quarterly audit and release cycles designed to ensure up-to-date compliance.
- Participated in various external forums to monitor regulatory changes, provide technical guidance, and develop joint solutions for compliance requirements including Title IV and Title IX.
- Served as Accreditation Liaison Officer (ALO) leading the design and delivery of WASC/WSCUC accreditation approval process. Responsible for working with cross functional teams, faculty, and regulators to obtain and maintain state operation licensure in order to provide access to education for historically underrepresented students.
- Developed student-first, data-driven learner experience programs designed to meet the target outcome of 95% job placement rate for alumni within 1 year of graduation. Achieved and sustained NPS of 60 for multiple consecutive quarters, representing consistent student satisfaction feedback with classroom instruction and support services. Led to 86% retention rate in historically underrepresented students in tech.
- Responsible for communication with key stakeholders including Board of Directors, state regulators, venture capitalist, non-profit donors, accreditation agencies, and prospective students.
